COLLEGE POLICY: GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING IN THE COLLEGE

Each Autumn and Winter semester, **Nursing Program** students must pass

- more than 50% of the courses in which they are registered and
- more than 50% of the Professional Program courses in which they are registered.

PROFESSIONAL SUITABILITY IN THE PROGRAM

Since the technology student is being educated for a specific profession, academic performance is not the only criterion for evaluating a student's standing. Individual aptitudes and capabilities may have to be considered in evaluating a student's suitability for a specific technology. Should a student be declared professionally unsuitable, the Faculty Dean may, on the recommendation of the program, require the student to withdraw from the Program.

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: STANDING

1. Students in **Nursing** must not fail the same 180 Nursing course twice, or must not fail any two 180 Nursing courses, specifically:

180-101-VA	Introduction to Nursing and Health
180-201-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges
180-301-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Adult and Elderly Persons 1 OR
180-302-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Childbearing and Childrearing Families 1
180-401-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Adult and Elderly Persons 1A OR
180-402-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Childbearing and Childrearing Families 1A
180-501-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Adult and Elderly Persons 2
180-601-VA	Nursing and Health Challenges in Adult and Elderly Persons 3

2. Students who fail Nursing 180-101 with less than 55% must leave the program. Students with 55% or over, who are otherwise in Good Academic Standing will be permitted to repeat Nursing 101.

All current college appeal procedures remain open to those students who fail Nursing 180-101.

3. Students who fail to comply with the Additional Program Standing Requirements will be required to request a Program Change.
4. Nursing students must complete the **Nursing Program** within five consecutive years.
5. Students who fail to comply with the Additional Program Standing Requirements must follow the Review Process of the Program in order to either:
 - be permitted to continue in the Program; or
 - be required to request a Program Change

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: ADVANCEMENT

1. To be permitted to register in semester 3 (or semester 5 if in Extended Program), students in the **Nursing** Program must have passed all Professional Program courses in semesters 1 through 2 as follows (or semesters 1 through 4 in **Extended Nursing** Program):

2. To be permitted to register in semester 5 (or semester 7 if in Extended Program), students in the **Nursing** Program must have passed all Professional Program courses in semesters 3 through 4, including Chemistry 201 and 301, if required or (or semesters 5 through 6 in **Extended Nursing** Program).
