WHAT FOLLOWS IS AN EXPLANATION OF ARTICLE 1.01, ONE OF THE KEY PROVISIONS OF THE NEW ACADEMIC SUCCESS BY-LAW.

ARTICLE 1.01

TO BE CONSIDERED IN GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING, ALL FULL TIME STUDENTS MUST:

- (1) PASS MORE THAN 50% OF THE COURSES IN WHICH THEY ARE REGISTERED;
- (2) PASS A MINIMUM OF 50% OF THE PROGRAM-SPECIFIC COURSES IN WHICH THEY ARE REGISTERED.

(1) This means that you must pass more than 50% of ALL the courses in which you are registered:

General Education courses:

- English
- French
- Humanities
- Physical Education
- Complementary

Program-specific courses, for example:

- Science: Calculus, Chemistry, Physics
- Social Science: History, Macroeconomics, Psychology, Quantitative Methods
- Nursing: Anatomy and Physiology, Introduction to Nursing and Health Challenges, Adult Development
- Business Administration: Accounting I, Introduction to Business, Business Computer Applications, Business Information and Research

Remedial courses, for example:

- Preparation for College English
- Secondary 4 Math
- Initiation au français, langue seconde

If in 8 courses overall, you must pass 5

If in 7 courses overall, you must pass 4

If in 6 courses overall, you must pass 4

If in 5 courses overall, you must pass 3

If in 4 courses overall, you must pass 3

(2) This means that you must pass a minimum of 50% of the program-specific courses in which you are registered.

See above for examples of program-specific courses.

If in 6 program-specific courses, you must pass 3

If in 5 program-specific courses, you must pass 3

If in 4 program-specific courses, you must pass 2

If in 3 program-specific courses, you must pass 2

If in 2 program-specific courses, you must pass 1

If in 1 program-specific course, you must pass 1
