SPECIAL EXHIBITION: "NEIGHBOURS WHO DISAPPEARED"

A unique and powerful exhibit from the Jewish Museum in Prague, "Neighbours Who Disappeared", will be displayed in the Vanier College Library from April 10th until May 2nd. Find out more below.



Based on the project of the Jewish Museum in Prague called "Neighbours Who Disappeared", Czech children and youth (ages 12-21) created mixed-media panels reflecting on the history of the Nazi Holocaust, as it affected their own cities and towns.

The resulting collages combine text, drawings, paintings, contemporary and historical photographs, and facsimiles of historical documents. The 19 panels vary in style and focus. Some are powerful journalistic and historical documentaries, with an abundance of factual detail, others are highly stylized artistic expressions.

"Neighbours Who Disappeared" is a project of the Jewish Museum in Prague, (logo at right) the Czech Republic, supported by the Forgotten Ones Civic Association. They both are pleased to present it in Canada.
